Applicant: The applicant for this project is Suwannee American Cement Company, LLC. The applicant's responsible official and mailing address are: John Ralph, Plant Manager, Suwannee American Cement Company, LLC, 5117 US Highway 27, Branford, Florida 32008.

Facility Location: The applicant operates the existing Branford Cement Plant, which is in Suwannee County at 5117 US Highway 27, Florida.

Project: The applicant applied on December 5, 2023, to the Department for an air construction permit and a revised Title V air operation permit. The existing facility is a Portland cement plant incorporating a dry process kiln with a preheater and calciner. The facility includes a surface limestone mine. The manufacture of Portland cement primarily involves the crushing, grinding, and blending of limestone, clays, and other raw materials into a chemically proportioned mixture which is heated in a rotary kiln to extremely high temperature to produce clinker nodules. The clinker is cooled and ground with a small quantity of gypsum and other additives to produce finished cement. Permit No. 1210465-061-AV revises Permit No. 1210465-050-AV to incorporate the concurrently issued Permit No. 1210465-060-AC, which clarifies a part of the facility-wide unconfined particulate matter condition and authorizes the subtraction of methane/ethane from the monitored Total Hydrocarbons to demonstrate compliance with the volatile organic carbon emissions limit. There will be no increase in pollutant emissions resulting from the project.

Permitting Authority: Applications for air construction permits are subject to review in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 403, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Chapters 62-4, 62-210 and 62-212 of the Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). The proposed project is not exempt from air permitting requirements and an air permit is required to perform the proposed work.

Decisions: A person whose substantial interests are affected by the proposed permitting decision may petition for an administrative hearing in accordance with Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3), F.S., must be filed within 14 days of publication of the Public Notice or receipt of a written notice, whichever occurs first. Under Section 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who asked the Permitting Authority for notice of agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of that notice, regardless of the date of publication.
